DEW DANCE. WHO WE ARE

Dew Dance is an emerging contemporary dance company in High Wycombe, creating engaging and thought-provoking dance work with a heart for the community; the residents that live here and the artists who work here.

Created by choreographer Liezl de Wouters, Dew Dance creates new dance work with a message. We also host community performance projects, offer dance workshops, form partnerships with local businesses and charities and build a local dance network.



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UNDER THE TREETOPS. THE SHOW

Under the treetops is an outdoor contemporary dance performance, celebrating nature and the significance of trees, intertwined with stories of the community. We explore how trees signify growth, sustain life and is a place of shelter. Trees are home.

This work weaves in stories from our community, It makes it more personal and allows us to bring our audience into the experience as well. Art is a key to bringing us all back to nature and unlocking our own stories.

By bringing this work to outdoor spaces, we invite the community to come along and experience nature, build relationships, get moving and be refreshed with a new sense of awe for our environment. We also encourage making new connections, having been isolated by ourselves for so long.

PARTICIPATION OPPORTUNITIES

Alongside performances, we have the ability to offer bespoke movement workshops to audiences for both recreational and educational purposes, post-show talks and Q&A sessions.

We welcome proposals for collaborations with existing events and opportunities to increase foot traffic and enhance the venue's already rich calendar of events.



SHOW DURATION: 15 minutes

CAST SIZE: 4 dancers, 1 technician (if not provided by venue)

AUDIENCE: Suitable for all ages and families,

SEATING: Front facing. Seating can be pre-set up by the venue or

audiences can be encouraged to bring camping chairs

or picnic blankets.

LICENCES: The venue is responsible for obtaining any necessary

local performance licences and/or permissions. No

music licences are required.

ACCESSIBILITY: Spoken word elements in the show will be made

available in written format (large print) and a voice-

recorded programme will be available.

FEES: It costs us £300 to cover our dancers for one event. This

is the minimum we need to make in order to break

even. We discuss funding possibilities with venues

directly - through ticketing, external funding or

audience donations.

TECHNICAL AND SHOW REQUIREMENTS

<u>Performance space:</u> Outdoor grass area, which is relatively flat and clear of obstacles. We tailor our performance bespoke to the space available. Minimum 4x3m area of grass.

Get-in/Get-out: Get in 1h30, and Get out 30min. It is preferable for 1 member of the company to visit the space beforehand to take pictures, evaluate the dance surface and understand any constraints or opportunities that the space provides.

<u>Sound equipment:</u> Dependent on the venue and audience size. Minimum 2 8" speakers set up outside, provided by the venue, with the ability to connect to a laptop.

Parking: Cast parking is required for 1 vehicle.

<u>Dressing room & toilets:</u> A safe room for dancers to wait in and store personal belongings.

<u>Risk assessment:</u> A full risk assessment will be made available at the earliest opportunity, and at least 1 week before the performance.
